- 2. Place the hydroCHLOROthiazide powder in a mortar and triturate to a fine powder.
- 3. Add a small amount of OraBlend and levigate to form a smooth paste.

- 5. Transfer contents to a graduated cylinder and add OraBlend via geometric dilution until reaching the final volume.
